JUNGLE OF BONES GAME INSTRUCTIONS

**Objective: Be the first
person to reach the
*SECOND ACE***

How To Play:

Starting with the oldest player at the table and going counterclockwise around the table, players will take turns rolling the die and moving the number of spaces corresponding to the roll of the die. If the player lands on a space with a question mark the player will be asked a trivia question from the trivia cards pile. If the player answers the question properly, he/she may remain on the space. If the question is answered incorrectly, the player will have to go back to the space he/she started from on this turn. If player lands on one of the specialty spaces, they should do the following, respectively:

Snake: You have been bitten by a snake; lose a turn.

Leeches: Leeches have attached themselves to your skin; wait a turn for them to be removed.

Malaria Pills: You have malaria. You must wait on this space until someone catches up to you. If you are the last person, you lose one turn.

When players reach the circle, they may select which way they would like to go, either to the left or to the right. The first player to reach the wreckage of Second Ace, wins!

1. HOW TO TEST A PLANT FOR EDIBILITY

- A. Hold the plant to the lips for five minutes.
- B. Break off the plant's leaves, stems, roots, and buds, then test each element separately.
- C. Rub the plant on the skin, wait 10 minutes and check for a rash.

2. HOW TO SURVIVE ON VEGETATION

- A. Only eat plants with shiny leaves.

3. HOW TO SURVIVE A POISONOUS SNAKE BITE

- A. Immediately place ice on the wound.

- A. Leave a glass out overnight to collect condensation and dew.

5. HOW TO FIND WATER IN THE WILDERNESS

- A. Look for an area where there are no animal droppings.

6. HOW TO FILTER WATER

- A. Pour the water through a sock filled with small crushed rock and sand.
